I trained in many treatment methods and offer clients the benefit of my varied training and experience. Client issues range from, but not limited to, anxiety, depression, grief and loss, relationship issues, communication skills, addictions, eating disorders and physical and sexual abuse. Dear Parishioners & visitors to Our Lady of Guadalupe,

Recently, a non-Catholic asked me if “my church” valued social justice. Just to be clear, “social justice” can be a very loaded term and mean whatever a particular person or group would like it to mean. However, for us Catholic Christians, it means something that is inseparable from the very core of our faith. In fact, I’ve always stated that the Creed we pray at every Mass is a statement of social justice. “How so, Joe?” you may ask. Well, the short answer is that the Creed is a statement of what we believe to be the truth, especially the truth about our God incarnated in the person of Jesus. Jesus was fully human and fully God. A fancy term we use for this is *hypostatic union* (just in case you need that for Jeopardy). Anyway, this unity between God and humanity is central to our Creed. Although we believe that Jesus was “begotten not made one in being with the Father”, there is no denying that this unity means that every person is created in God’s image. This belief has always been and remains at the core of Catholic Social teaching. Mt. 22: 36-40 reminds us that love of God *and* neighbor is inseparable. Put quite simply, we cannot worship a homeless man on Sunday and ignore one on Monday. We can easily slip into the worship of an image of God and ignore the plight of those made in God’s image. We cannot ensure that the Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament has a suitable roof over his head in our church tabernacle but the Jesus in the homeless person has none over his or hers in our world.

In his third encyclical, *Caritas in Veritate* (Charity in Truth) the first on social teaching, Benedict XVI continues a long history of the Catholic Church’s insistence that the dignity of the human person is primary to any economic or social system. Our Creed contains what we believe to be true. Benedict reminds us that Jesus teaches us that there can be no truth that does not lead us to love of God and neighbor. Also, love without the Truth as its ultimate goal risks becoming merely a human emotion and not a Gospel mandate. Whenever we celebrate the Holy Mass, we are making a bold statement of what we believe about God *and* humanity. In a sense, every Mass is a social justice meeting and every parish is a social justice committee. Why? Because social justice is love and love leads us to THE Truth, Christ.

I ask all of us to consider if we make the connection between what we do and say inside the church on Sunday with how we live Monday to Saturday. Atheists can feed the hungry, clothe the naked, house the homeless, care for the sick and visit the lonely-and all without a Sunday collection or a homily! So what makes our efforts any different? Why should the Mass, the Creed, the parish community, our Catholic social teaching and ultimately all that is our Catholic faith, make a difference? The answer is that ultimately, we believe that anyone who looks upon the face of another human being, especially one who is needy and vulnerable, looks upon the face of love incarnated. We are beings, not ideas. Ideologies, political and social systems and philosophies come and go but no parent has ever cried over a dying ideology. No spouse has ever been held in the dark of night by a philosophy. No child has ever reached for the arms of a system. For love to have meaning beyond its expression, it must come from something beyond the one who expresses it. For the Christian, it comes not from a something but from a Someone, Jesus Christ. When we love Him, we don’t love an idea of Him, we love a living image of Him who is with us here and now often times needy and vulnerable. Ideas may inspire us but they can never die for us. Live what you believe without regard for what others may think about the one who believes it and you will understand. Do we value social justice? We value the dignity of human life, is that just? **Lent is coming, March 9th: ready, set...love!** Have a blessed week everybody.
